## Extensive academic and social programme

Students participate in 15 hours of Spanish classes a week as well as an extensive programme of sports and cultural activities in the afternoon

- 3 lessons of 45 min each a day in the morning 10.20 - 12.50
- Sports, Social and Cultural Activities 12.50-14.00, 16.30-19.30
- Lunch between 14.00 - 16.30

## Course includes

- 15 hours tuition per week Monday to Friday
- Full sports and activities programme in the afternoons. 3 hours a day Monday to Friday
- 1 full day excursion every two weeks
- 1 evening activity per week
- 1 half-day every two weeks
- Full Board host family or residence accommodation
- Airport transfer return
- Certificate of attendance on completion on the course

## Objectives of the Programme

- To study and for the students to enjoy themselves, both inside and outside the classroom, experiencing a new adventure everyday.
- To learn the basis of what makes a team player through the participation in classroom, sports and cultural activities.
- To learn Spanish and enjoy spending time in Málaga or Alicante visiting various parts of the cities.
- To enhance the student's ability to handle daily tasks without the support and protection of their parents
- To make new friends and build social relationships.

## Course description - Academic

Despite a strong focus on our teaching and learning methodology, we do not forget that this is a course for juniors and that it is very important that they enjoy their holiday. With this in mind, the language classes are designed to provide interest and entertain the students whilst maintaining a level of professionalism and seriousness. Our aim is to provide optimum benefits for the time spent while maintaining an enjoyable atmosphere.

### • Our Teachers

The success and character of Idiomas ¡Sí! depends very much on the quality of our staff and we are very proud of our professional team of teachers. All our teachers are native Spaniards holding university degrees as well as the Certificate of Teaching Ability (CAP) and work under the supervision of our Director of Studies.

They meet regularly to discuss the student's progress and they work together as a team to plan and prepare the course.

### • Monitor

There is a coordinator for the juniors group. He is responsible for leisure activities and the welfare of the young students.

The monitor/coordinator will be available in the afternoons and will be in charge of the workshops, activities and excursions organised.

The coordinator will accompany the students on the excursions and field trips to places of interest, as well as organising the sports programme, co-ordinating workshops and dealing exclusively with the young students.

### • Sports, Social and Cultural Activities

The students will have a full leisure programme with a wide range of activities during their stay.

### • Visits to places of interest

On Thursday afternoons every week the students will visit different sites in the city.

There are at least three different destinations that the students will visit during the month. In all visits a team of monitors will accompany the students.

### • Excursions

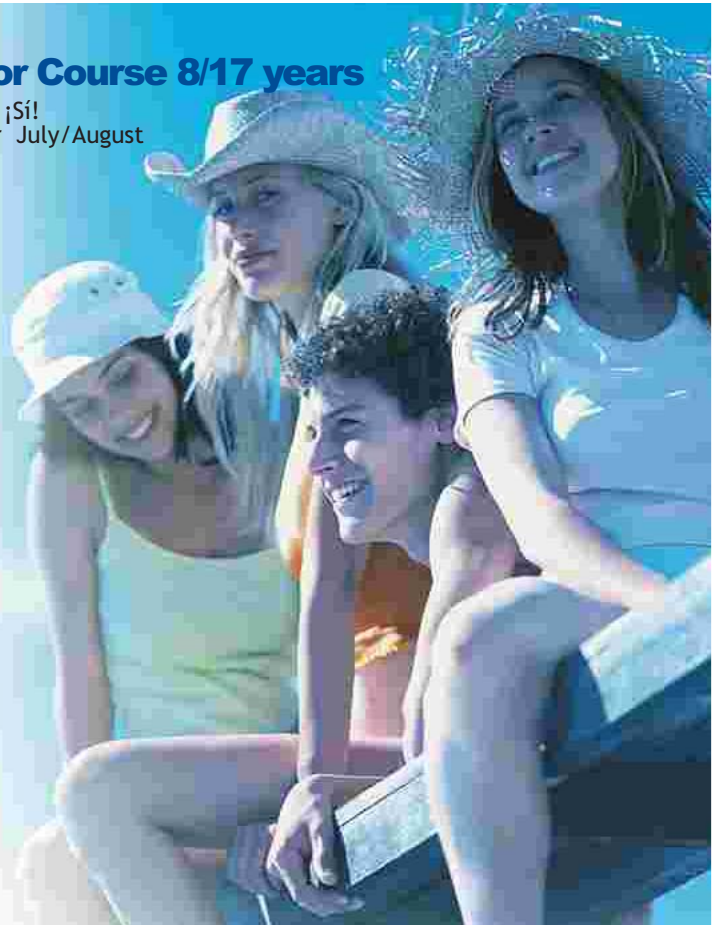
During the weekends the students will visit various cities in the Andalusian and Alicante regions.

### • Our Host Families - Friendly and welcoming

Living in a Spanish Family home, getting to know Spanish family life, customs, food, and using Spanish in everyday situations, is one of the most important parts of your stay in Spain.

All the students will have full board accommodation that includes breakfast, lunch and dinner, and will receive a packed lunch during field trips. Most of our families host two students at a time although some accept three. We guarantee that no students with the same mother tongue are placed in the same family, unless two friends ask to share. You can ask on the enrolment form for all the special requirements that you might need.

### • Security

Our students will enjoy a safe and caring environment during their study holiday, as our experienced staff and host families provide guidance and supervision at all times.

### • Security for parents and students

An experienced monitor will take care of all of the students needs outside the classroom. Our professional team of monitors will accompany the students throughout their stay and be available for all questions the students have.

Our host families are extensively prepared and experienced in receiving young students from outside Spain. They are all thoroughly vetted by the school and people of great confidence who enjoy opening their houses to share the local customs and culture with young students.
